	(a) The Chairman has exhorted the member banks to extract maximum benefit out of the extension of enrollment dates under PMJJBY (without self-certificate of good health) and PMSBY up to 31 <sup>st</sup> May, 2016. He also stressed upon publicizing APY since the co-contribution date has been extended up to 31 <sup>st</sup> March, 2016.
	(b) The claims under PMJJBY and PMSBY appears to be, not in congruence with the death rates prevailing at the state. LDMs and member banks to remain in touch with the local bodies for information about normal and accidental deaths occurring in their areas so that the nominees could be guided suitably to lodge claims under these insurance schemes.
